1. Facilities update

Portable construction is on target to occupy beginning August 8th. Once the portables are turned over to CLCS we will install our tech infrastructure, install blinds and white boards, and furnish so that rooms are up and ready to go for the first day of school.

2. Charter Renewal

Nea begins charter renewal on August 23, 2018 and ACLC will begin the charter renewal process in August 2019. The charter renewal will be assessed according to the following Charter Renewal Standards:

- I) Is the school academically sound?
- II) Is the school an effective, viable organization?
- III) Has the school been faithful to the terms of its charter and operated consistent with the law?

In addition to the three areas above, evaluation of a charter school renewal request will take into consideration its “plans for a future charter term” as described in the renewal petition pursuant to the questions asked in Education Code 47605:

- IV) Are the school’s plans for a future charter term reasonably comprehensive?
 - a. Does the renewal petition contain reasonably comprehensive descriptions of the required elements?
 - b. Does the renewal petition contain the required affirmations and assurances?

AUSD General Counsel provided CLCS with the criteria for charter renewal on May 25th. Nea will need to submit the following to AUSD on August 23rd:

- Updated petition consistent with Cal. Educ. Code
- Local Control Accountability Plans for current and two prior years

- Budget and cash flow projections up to 2021
- Student enrollment for past three years, broken down by grade and in-district/non-district enrollment
- Executed legal assurances
- Complaint policies and procedures
- Admissions policies
- Conflict of Interest policies and procedures
- Most recent WASC accreditation report
- Student discipline policies and due process procedures
- Signed 30-day extension agreement

From the date of the submittal, AUSD has 60-days to vote on approval. For Nea, AUSD is requesting that we sign a 30-day extension agreement providing them with a total of 90 days requiring the newly seated board vote in November.

3. Nea Lead Facilitator Hiring Update

I am pleased to inform the Board that we have offered the Lead Facilitator position at Nea to Matthew Wienclawski, who accepted with excitement! Matthew Wienclawski was born and raised in Pennsylvania. He comes from a family of educators who inspired him to enter the classroom. He is an accomplished visionary leader with 5 years of operational, planning, and administrative experience within the charter school sector. He is a member of the Association of California School Administrators and an advocate for the California Charter School Association.

Matthew looks forward to continuing Nea's strong tradition of active and exploratory learning. He is focused on upholding the school's mission and will strive to maintain inclusivity and equity. Matthew had the pleasure of attending Nea's graduation ceremony and will visit with the staff on June 4th.
