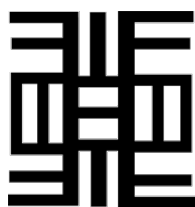

CAASPP Complete

The CAASPP assessment concluded the week of June 1st with make-up testing. The CAASPP assists us in measuring how well we are performing as a school and how to better serve each child. It also gives learners (and their parents) an indication of how they are performing in both math and English.

We are interested in seeing the results of the Smarter Balanced Assessment - particularly as this is the second time that students' knowledge of the Common Core State Standards has been assessed and we will have data to compare with 2014-2015. We believe that we have put our learners in a good position to do well on the Smarter Balanced Assessment but it is important to realize that the scores that they receive are just one indicator of how well they are performing academically. We will share the results soon after we receive them from the state.

Hiring Updates

Our hiring committee is currently in the hiring process for the 2016-2017 school year.
